



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

Mallory (1989) *In Search of the Indo-Europeans*, fig. 103.



Mallory (1989) *In Search of the Indo-Europeans*, fig. 112.



Mallory (1989) *In Search of the Indo-Europeans*, fig.125.

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



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


Fig. 2.14
Horse-Keeping Cultures in Caucasia and Transcaucasia



Overview- Archaeological Finds of Horse Remains in the Middle East



Principal Trade Routes along the Euphrates and in the Khabur region.

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




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















Withers Height over Time



Comparison between Withers Height and Age







fig. 76.A.






FIG. 2. The hieroglyph of a horse as rendered by Hay and Wilkinson.









PM 1 (1) 143-144 (3)



Säve-Söderbergh (1957) *Four Private Tombs at Thebes*, pl. 3.





Davies (1961) "Fragment of a Punt Scene" *JEA* 47 (1961), pl. 5.











PM I (1) 263-265 (3, 10)



Säve-Söderbergh (1957) *Four Eighteenth Dynasty Tombs*, pl. 16.





PM I 91) 21-24 (7)





PM I (1) 175-178 (5,8)





pl. 12.





PM I (1) 257-258 (2)



Davies (1932) *Work of the Graphic Branch*, fig. 9.





pl.3.



Tylor (1895) *The Tomb of Paheri*, pl.3.

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

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

PM 1 (1) 71-75 (3, 8-9)



Davies (1923) *The Tomb of Puyemre at Thebes*, pl.12.



Davies (1923) *The Tomb of Puyemre at Thebes*, pl. 23.

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



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



PM I (1) 35-37 (10)




Fig. 4.50







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

PM 1 (1) 170-175 (2)



Kulturgegeschichte*, pl.94



Rommelaere (1991) *Les chevaux du Nouvel Empire égyptien*, 165 (23) (Line drawing)

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

PM I (1) 82-83 (4,5)



Wreszinski (1988) *Atlas zur altaegyptischen Kulturegeschichte*, pl. 42.



Davies (1933) *The Tombs of Menkheperasonb, Amenmose and Another*, pl. 35.

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



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



Bulletin*, 30, no. 11. pt 2, fig.3.



à l' etude de l'art égyptien*,2, pl.67.

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

PM I (1) 190-194 (9)



Art*, 5, 1930, pl. 22.

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



Kulturgeschichte*, 1, pl.307.

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



PM I (1) 142 -143(4)



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

Houlihan (1996) *Animal World of the Pharaohs*, pl. 15.





Capart (1927 -1931) *Documents pour servir à l'etude de l'art égyptien*, 2 pl.67.

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

PM I (1) 330 (2-3)



Hartwig (2004) *Tomb Painting and Identity in Ancient Thebes, 1419-1372BCE*, fig. 44.



PM I (1) 157 (10)



pl.2.4b



Shedid(988) *Stil der Grabmalereien in der Zeit Amenophis II*, pl. 2.4

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

PM 1 (1) 179-181







Thoutmosis IV*, pl. 11.



Thoutmosis IV*, pl. 10.

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

PM I (1) 146-149 (2,4)





PM I (1) 132-133 (2)



Davies (1963) *Scenes from Some Theban Tombs*, pl. 8.

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

PM 1 (1) 144-146 (10)



Brack & Brack (1977) *Das Grab des Tjanuni. Theben Nr. 74*, pl. 39.



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

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

PM I (1) 125-128 (9, 11, 12)



Sobekhotep*, pl. 33.





PM I (1) 379 (3)



(2003) *The Tomb of Amenemopet Called Tjanefer at Thebes. (TT 297)*, pl.3.



The Tomb of Amenemopet Called Tjanefer at Thebes. (TT 297), pl.3.

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

PM I (I) 181-183 (14-15)



9/1/2010)



25.

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



Kulturgegeschichte*, 1 pl. 290.



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

PM I (1) 152-156 (8,9)





b Rückkehr von Abydos, Szene 11.1

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

PM I (1) 275-276 (7)



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



Rommelaere (1991) *Les chevaux du Nouvel Empire égyptien*, 191, pl. 55a.

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

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

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





 Lauffray (1979) *Karnak d'Égypte, domaine du divin*, fig. 140.



 Redford(1988) *The Akhenaten Temple Project. Vol 2: Rwd-mnw, Foreigners and Inscriptions*, pl. 17



 Redford (1988) *The Akhenaten Temple Project. Vol 2: Rwd-mnw, Foreigners and Inscriptions*, pl. 18.



 Redford (1988) *The Akhenaten Temple Project. Vol 2: Rwd-mnw, Foreigners and Inscriptions*, pl. 19.

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

20.







Hanke (1978) *Amarna-Reliefs aus Hermopolis; neue Veröff.u. Studien*,231.



Hanke (1978) *Amarna-Reliefs aus Hermopolis; neue Veröff.u. Studien*, 230.



Hanke (1978) *Amarna-Reliefs aus Hermopolis; neue Veröff.u. Studien*, 230.







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

PM 4, 214 (7, 9-10)



pl.32a.






Ziegler (2002) *The Pharaohs*, Catalogue pl. 109.

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

PM 4, 228-230 (6-8,9)




Davies (1908) *The Rock Tombs of El-Amarna. Part VI. The Tombs of Parennefer, Tutu and Ay*, pl. 25



Davies (1908) *The Rock Tombs of El-Amarna. Part VI. The Tombs of Parennefer, Tutu and Ay*, pl. 30.

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

PM 4, 211-112 (5-6, 8, 9-10)



Davies (1905) *The Rock Tombs of El Amarna. Part III. The Tombs of Huya and Ahmes*, pl. 8.



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

9-10,11)



IV. pl.17.*



IV. pl.19.*




Fig. 4.186a, b.

IV. pls.(12c) & 20.*





Fig. 4.187a,b

and Others.Part IV. pls. 41 & 22.*



Tombs of Penthu, Mahu and Others.Part IV. pl.26*

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

PM 4, 214-217 (8, 9-10, 11)



Davies (1903) *The Rock Tombs of El-Amarna. Part 1. The Tomb of Meryra*, pl.6.



Davies (1903) *The Rock Tombs of El-Amarna. Part 1. The Tomb of Meryra*, pl.17.



Davies (1903) *The Rock Tombs of El-Amarna. Part 1. The Tomb of Meryra*, pl.17.



Davies (1903) *The Rock Tombs of El-Amarna. Part 1. The Tomb of Meryra*, pl.19.

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

Davies (1903) *The Rock Tombs of El-Amarna. Part 1. The Tomb of Meryra*, pl.22.





Davies (1903) *The Rock Tombs of El-Amarna. Part 1. The Tomb of Meryra*, pl.29.

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




Davies (1905) *The Rock Tombs of El-Amarna. Part II. The Tombs of Panhesy and Meryra II*, pl.33.



Davies (1905) *The Rock Tombs of El-Amarna. Part II. The Tombs of Panhesy and Meryra II*, pl.37.



Davies (1905) *The Rock Tombs of El-Amarna. Part II. The Tombs of Panhesy and Meryra II*, pl. 37.

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

PM 4, 218-219 (9, 10-11)



Davies (1905) *The Rock Tombs of El-Amarna. Part II. The Tombs of Panhesy and Meryra II*, pl. 13.





Davies (1905) *The Rock Tombs of El-Amarna. Part II. The Tombs of Panhesy and Meryra II*, pl. 13.

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

PM 4, 219-221 (1-2, 9-10)



Davies (1908) *The Rock Tombs of El Amarna. Part VI. The Tombs of Parennefer, Tutu and Ay*, pl.2.



Davies (1908) *The Rock Tombs of El Amarna. Part VI. The Tombs of Parennefer, Tutu and Ay*, pl.5.



Davies (1908) *The Rock Tombs of El Amarna. Part VI. The Tombs of Parennefer, Tutu and Ay*, pl. 4.






Davies (1906) *The Rock Tombs of El Amarna. Part IV. The Tombs of Penthu, Mahu and Others*, pl. 8.

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

PM 4, 221-222 (9-11)



Davies (1908) *The Rock Tombs of El-Amarna. Part VI. The Tombs of Parennefer, Tutu and Ay*, pl. 19.



Davies(1908) *The Rock Tombs of El-Amarna. Part VI. The Tombs of Parennefer, Tutu and Ay*, pl. 18.







Davies & Gardiner (1926) *The Tomb of Huy*, pl. 12.



Age*, 6.




Fig. 4.222 TU (1) Amenhotep Huy







Lid A



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

TU (3) Sennedjem- Akhmim















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

PM I (1) 91-95 (6)



at Thebes. pl.16.



Neferhotep at Thebes. pl.16.







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

PM I (1) 78-80 (17)



pl. 31



PM I (1) 395-396 (8)



Davies (1948) *Seven Private Tombs at Kurnah*, pl. 32.



PM I (1) 97-99 (3)







The University of Chicago, Oriental Institute Publications, Chicago. Vol. IV. pl. 11.





PM I (1) 47-49 (4,5,6)













Ricke, Hughes & Wente (1967) *The Beit el-Wali Temple of Ramesses II* (North wall)



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

fig.8, sc. 1.













The Reliefs, Inscriptions and Commentary, pl. 123.



Davies (1948) *Seven Private Tombs at Kurnah*, pl.32.



Martin (1997) *The Tomb of Tia and Tia. A Royal Monument of the Ramesside Period in the Memphite Necropolis*, 111.

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

Davies (1903) *The Rock Tombs of El-Amarna, Part 1*, pl. 10.

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

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

Davies (1906) *The Rock Tombs
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

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

David & Archbold (2000) *Conversations with Mummies*, 142.



Davies (1908) *Tombs of Parennefer, Tutu and Ay*, pl.4.

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



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(1998) *Egypt. The World of
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

Tutankhamun, hunting,
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



David & Archbold (2000) *Conversations with Mummies*, 142.

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

Pharaohs*, pl.15.



The Rock Tombs of El-Amarna, Part IV, pl. 26.



Seti I
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





Kitchen (1997) *Pharaoh Triumphant*, fig.19.







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



Brack & Brack (1980) *das Grab des Haremheb*. *Theben Nr. 78*, pl.87.



Davies (1923) *The Tombs of Two Officials of Thutmose IV*, pl.29.





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

 Davies (1905) *The Tombs of Panehesy and Meryre II*, pl.11.



 Tylor & Griffith (1895) *The Tomb of Paheri*, pl.3.






Fig. 7.31 Comparison of withers heights over time.













Penthu, Mahu and Others*, pl.26.



Graphic Branch*, fig. 3.













Fig. 7.38. Proportion of humans to horses overall





Fig. 7.39 Proportion of humans to horses including Ramesside numbers





of the human in direct contact.














pl. 31.







Davies (1906) *The Tombs of Penthu, Mahu and Others*, pl. 5.



Davies (1903) *The Tomb of Meryre*, pl. 10.



Davies (1905) *The Tombs of Panehesy and Meryre II*, pl. 33.













Nebamun*, pl.109.

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



Seidel (1998) *Egypt*, pl. 33.











Seti I University of Chicago (1986) *The Battle Reliefs of King Seti I*, pl. 35.











Harris (1993) *Horse Gaits, Balance and Movement*, 36.









Desroches-Nobelcourt (1971) *Grand temple d'Abou Simbel: la bataille de Qadech*, pl.4.









Der Manuelian (1987) *Studies in the Reign of Amenophis II*, fig.44.










Davies (1903) *The Rock Tombs of El-Amarna. Part I- The Tomb of Meryre*, pl. 10.

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







Thutmose the Fourth*, pl. 29.





Capart (1927) *Documents pour servir a l'etude de l'art Egyptien*, 1, pl.67.























Paheri*, pl. 3.








Fig. 10.13









Littauer & Crowell (1985) *Chariots and Related Equipment from the Tomb of Tutankhamun*, pls. 74 & 38.







Amarna Part 2*, pl.11.















Davies (1905) *The Rock Tombs of El-Amarna. Part II- The Tombs of Panehesy and Meryra II*, pl. 11.







Partially Hogged Mane









Harris (2008) *Grooming to Win*, fig. 116.

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





A. II, pl.12.



Nubia. Tomo Primo. Monumenti Storici*, pl. 81.









pl. 26.

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

22.



Tylor & Griffiths (1895) *The Tomb of Paheri*, pl.3.





Davies (1905) *The Rock Tombs of El-Amarna. Part II. The Tombs of Panhesy and Meryra II*, pl.13.









Davies (1903) *The Rock Tombs of El-Amarna, Part I. The Tomb of Meryra*, pl. 25.





Hanke (1978) *Amarna-reliefs aus Hermopolis*, 231.





(Nos. 86, 112, 42 and 226) pl.12.





Davies (1963) *Scenes from some Theban Tombs*, pl.18.



Freed (1983) *Egypt's Golden Age*, 6.



Desroches- Noblecourt (1963) *Tutankhamun*, pl.144.











Davies (1963) *Egyptian Tomb Paintings*, pl.18



El-Amarna, The Tomb of Meryra*, pl. 32



11



Quibell & Hayter (1927) *Excavations at Saqqara; Teti Pyramid, North Side*, pl. 12











