- 1. Install hose reels and hydrants throughout the entire building as specified by the provisions of Parts 27.3 and 27.4 of Ordinance 70.
- 2. Provide emergency lighting and illuminated exit signs throughout the entire building as specified by the provisions of Clauses 24.29, 55.12 and 55.13 of Ordinance 70.
- 3. Remove all barrel bolts, deadlocks, chains and padlocks to all exit doors and doors leading to an exit door and replace with a latch that complies with Clause 24.20(7) of Ordinance 70.
- 4. Install a one hour fire rated shelter and a one hour fire rated door and jamb and self-closer to the kitchen servery, adjacent to the Peninsula bar room.
- 5. Install a fire blanket in the kitchen located in the first floor.
- 6. Install two kilogram CO2 fire extinguishers in the kitchen located on the first floor.
- 7. Install an approved alarm device in the coolrooms located in the kitchen on the first floor and the coolroom located on the ground floor as specified by the provisions of Clause 53.2(1)(b) of Ord 70.
- 8. Construct a two hour fire rated wall around the dumb waiters service hoist located in the kitchen and in the cellar on the ground floor specified by Clause 16.8 of Ordinance 70.
- 9. Install a one hour fire rated door to both dumb waiter and service hoist, the doors to be so designed that they only open at the level at which the dumb waiter is parked.

- 10. Install one hour fire rated ceiling doors and jambs to the cleaners cupboards, situated on the western side of the auditorium on the first floor under the bio box.
- 11. Install an approved device to the egress door on the southern elevation adjacent to the Red Piano Bar to enable the door to be held in a fully open position as specified by Clause 24.20(5)(b) of Ordinance 70.
- 12. Install a one hour fire rated door and jamb and self-closer to the storage cupboard between the stairs giving from the kitchen on the first floor.
- 13. Increase the stair width to 1020 mm between handrails of the egress stairs on the eastern elevation as specified by Clause 24.23 of Ordinance 70.
- 14. Remove the steel grill to the egress door from the motel section on the eastern elevation to the ground floor.
- 15. Reinstate the egress door from the motel section on the eastern elevation to working order.
- 16. Install one hour fire rated doors, jambs and self-closers to all motel entry doors and public rooms that have access from the internal hallway as specified by Clause 24.23 of Ordinance 70.
- 17. Remove servery hatches and fan lights that are located in the walls of the motel units fronting the public corridor and seal the opening to provide a one and a half hour fire rating.
- 18. Install panic bolts as specified by Clause 24.52(8) of Ordinance 70 to the doors in the first floor main lounge auditorium in the northern and western walls, and those doors being hung in two folds, and to be made to open outwards.
- 19. Install smoke detectors in the Piano Bar, auditorium, cellar and the detectors being connected to the control circuit of the air conditioning unit located in the cellar so that in the event of activation the air conditioning system will automatically cease operation.
- 20. Install an external hydrant within 90m from the exit doors of the building.
- 21. Remove all Cane-ite ceiling material to the first floor and install a 13 mm fire protective grade plasterboard ceiling throughout the entire first floor ceiling.
- 22. Provide a 13 mm fire protective grade plasterboard to the partition wall between the dining room and the bar located on the first floor.

- 23. Remove the concertina door located within the auditorium.
- 24. Install a partition wall from floor to ceiling lined both sides with 13mm fire protective grade plasterboard between the bistro and the public bar.
- 25. Install 35mm solid core doors with self-closers to the office, dressing rooms, storeroom in the auditorium and to the staff room and stage to the auditorium.
- 26. Install a one hour fire rated metal shutter to the opening between the southern bar and the auditorium.
- 27. Install an egress door opening in the direction of travel adjacent to the roller shutter in the cellar storeroom on the eastern side of the building.
- 28. Install 35mm solid core doors with self-closing device to:
 - (i) The Red Piano Bar to the internal corridor.
 - (ii) The cellar storeroom to the internal corridor.
 - (iii) Staff rooms to the internal corridor.
 - (iv) Caretaker's flat to the internal corridor.
 - (v) The scullery room to the internal corridor.
- 29. Remove the cupboard enclosure beneath the internal stair connecting the first and ground floor.
- 30. Provide a 13 mm fire protective grade plasterboard around all internal electrical switchboards.
- 31. Provide a total egress stair width from the first floor to the lower level to 10.71m.

Note: In the event that the conditions attached to any licence under the Liquor Act 1982 permit the number of persons occupying the Main Lounge/Auditorium exceeding 408, then the Council will require, and may issue, further notices under Section 317(D)(1) of the Local Government Act, the following works specified hereunder:

- (a) (i) Increase the total number of exits from the main lounge/auditorium from 2 to 5 with a total door width of 10.20m.
 - (ii) Increase the total egress stair width from the first floor to the lower level to 17.34m.

Appendix C

Director of Liquor and Gaming v Phoenician Club of Australia Ltd

On 26 October 1995 John Timothy Lynch, the Director of Liquor and Gaming, made a complaint that the Phoenician Club of Australia Limited, a club registered under the Registered Clubs Act 1976:

- 1. Permitted "rave parties" or "dance parties" and live band performances to take place in the auditorium of the defendant club, and attendance was open to members of the public generally for said "rave parties" or "dance parties" and live band performances not being functions within the meaning of s23 of the Act; and
- 2. The defendant club has not exercised its certificate of registration in the public interest in that on the dates specified in ground 1(i) above (those being dates particularised ranging from 7 April 1995 to 21-22 October 1995) the defendant club permitted "rave parties" or "dance parties" and live band performances to take place, attendance at which was open to members of the public generally, including persons under the age of 18 years, being persons not otherwise entitled to use the accommodation, facilities or amenities of the defendant club.

Grounds of Complaints

Ground One

"The requirements of section 10(1) have not been met in relation to the Defendant Club in that the Defendant Club did not keep, in accordance with section 10(1)(l) of the Act, correct accounts and books in respect of the financial affairs of the Defendant Club showing the particulars usually shown in accounts and books of a like nature."

Ground Two

"Liquor has been illegally sold, supplied or disposed of on the premises of the Defendant Club during the period of 2 years that last preceded the making of the complaint."

Ground Three

"Section 17(1AA)(a)(xi)

A rule of the Defendant Club has been habitually broken in that the Defendant Club failed to keep registers for the purpose of section 30(2)(k) of the Act in accordance with the provisions of section 31(1)(c) of the Act in respect of the period January 6 to October 1995 inclusive."

Ground Four

"A rule of the Defendant Club has been habitually broken in that the Defendant Club failed to keep registers for the purpose of section 30(2)(l) and 30(2)(m) of the Act in accordance with the provisions of section 31(1)(d) and 31(1)(e) of the Act in respect of the period January to October 1995 inclusive."

Ground Five

"Section 17(1AA)(a)(xiv)

"The Defendant Club has failed to comply with a Condition to which its Certificate of Registration is subject in that the Defendant Club has failed to satisfy certain of the conditions relating to the keeping, using and operating of poker machines set out in Schedule 2, Registered Clubs Regulation 1983 which are conditions of the Defendant Club's Certificate of Registration by the combined effect of section 9A(6) of the Act and the Clause 20J Registered Clubs regulation 1983."

Ground Six

"Section 17(1AA)(e)

"The Defendant Club failed to provide explanations of cancelled credit discrepancies, jackpot discrepancies and cash flow discrepancies as required by section 87H of the Act in quarterly returns lodged with the Liquor Administration Board for the quarters ended 31 May 1994, 31 August 1994, 30 November 1994 and 28 February 1995."

Ground Seven

"The Defendant Club did not keep registers in accordance with section 30(2)(k) and 30(2)(l) of the Act in that registers in respect of various dates between 1 January, 1995 to 14 November 1995 were not kept or, in the alternative, if the registers were kept, that the Defendant Clubfailed to comply with a Notice to Produce issued by the Complainant under Section 27A(4) of the Act dated 13 November 1995 in that the Defendant Club failed to produce certain registers of guests under section 30(2)(k) of the Act and registers of temporary members under section 30(2)(l) of the Act in respect of period 1 January 1995 to 14 November 1995."

Ground Eight

"The Defendant Club failed to exercise its certificate of registration in the public interest in that, on 21-22 October 1995, persons under the age of 18 years were allowed to be present in areas of the Defendant Club in which poker machines were situated and further that the Defendant Club failed to take steps to ensure that persons under the age of 18 years would not be present in areas of the Defendant Club in which poker machines were situated, and further the Defendant Club failed to ensure effective supervision to prevent persons under the age of 18 years from being present in the said areas and failed to have a system in operation ensuring that persons under the age of 18 years were forthwith removed from the said areas."

Ground Nine

"The Defendant Club failed to exercise its certificate of registration in the public interest in that, on 21-22 October 1995, Joanne Katherine Monk, a person under the age of 18 years, being 15 years of age, operated a poker machine on the premises of the Defendant Club."

Ground Ten

"The Defendant Club failed to exercise its certificate of registration in the public interest in that, on 21-22 October 1995 the drug, esctasy, and other prohibited drugs within the meaning of the Drug Misuse and Trafficking Act 1985 were being used by persons attending the Apache Dance Party at the Defendant Club and were available for sale on or in the immediate vicinity of the premises of the Defendant Club and were obtained by purchase or otherwise and consumed by persons on or in the immediate vicinity of the premises of the Defendant Club."

Ground Eleven

"The Defendant Club failed to exercise its certificate of registration in the public interest in that, on 21-22 October 1995 it did not have adequate security staff available to monitor and control the conduct of patrons attending the Apache Dance Party and to prevent the use and sale of prohibited drugs within the meaning of the Drug Misuse and Trafficking Act 1985 on or in the immediate vicinity of the premises of the Defendant Club."
